almost as much as the dues so it doesn't make economic sense. Beginning now the basic cost of a web page for members will be \$25 (still an incredibly good deal!). The url will be www.hawaiicraftsmen.org/PersonsName.htm.

The webpage will consist of 4 -5 images of a member's work and one portrait image of the artist with contact information. The photos should be 72 dpi jpegs of at least 800 pixels wide so that large pop-up versions of each art work can be shown. The photos should be sent directly to Marsha Eaton, the HC Webmaster, at marsha@hawaii.rr.com and can be sent in one batch as attachments since Road Runner allows large files.

The page can also contain an artist's statement, resume including showings, galleries, collectors, etc. It should be submitted in Word or online in an email as text. See www.hawaiicraftsmen.org/JeromeHeck.htm for a good example of an average size page.

The page usually takes just a day to develop and a test page will be sent to the artist for approval before it is 'live' and added to the member list. If the artist has a website, they should include the link to go on their page, too.

Payment can be made via PayPal at Alohamarketing.com/payment.htm or a check (Marsha can invoice if one is necessary for business records). Updating present member websites with new photos, additional or changed copy will be \$10. Changing contact information or typos is free.

A member who already has a website can send the url to Marsha to be linked at no charge.

There is no hosting charge to members on the Hawaii Craftsmen web site but it is only for members in good standing. If dues are delinquent, the member's webpage will be taken off the site but archived so that when dues are up-to-date, the webpage will be uploaded again. There will be no additional charge to do this. So those of you who presently have web pages should make sure your membership is current.

News from/about the neighbor islands will be featured here. Deadline for submissions is the 20th of each month to newsletter@hawaiicraftsmen.org

In the interest of serving the neighbor islands better and to address the perpetual question, "How does HC membership benefit me when I don't live on Oahu?", we are changing the way we do Aha Hana Lima in 2012. At the request of neighbor island board members, the full HC board has decided to extend the 'Aha workshops to the Neighbor Islands with the same 3 day, full workshop format as Oahu. We've yet to hear from one artist but so far the other 2, **John Cogswell** for metals and **Chris Gustin** for ceramics, are willing to do 2 workshops in Hawaii.

To cover honorarium, per diem and transportation costs for the guest artist, we will need, at the very least, 5 paid participants and someone on the ground who will coordinate and host the guest artist. We can't pay as well so we make up for it with gorgeous locations and lots of aloha!

There are still some kinks to iron out in executing this but the board has made a commitment to serve the neighbor islands and so it will be up to HC members out there to come through and support our efforts. Needless to say, it needs to fly in 2012, if it's to continue.

With this, we will be taking 2 (ASJE and Aha) of our 3 major *annual* programs out beyond Oahu. We will keep you updated and by next month, we hope to have schedules, contracts signed, etc.
