Founded in 1977, Raku Hoʻolauleʻa (a celebration of raku) brings together ceramic artists to participate in raku and related firing techniques at a campout which is held in a beautiful beach setting on the North Shore of Oʻahu. The exhibition is juried by renowned raku artists **Ramon Camarillo** (contemporary category) and **Bob McWilliams** (traditional category).

Try raku! You can glaze ceramic tea bowls under the direction of Hawai'i Craftsmen members, see them fired using the raku process, and take your finished tea bowls home that day.
