It's funny that Hawaii was a place I never wanted to go. It was the last state in the union that I visited. Yet since my first trip, at the invitation of Pat Hickman, then at UH, I have grown increasingly



enamored of the place, fascinated with the topography, the vegetation, and the people. I'm delighted to have had this opportunity to visit the Big Island and Kauai for the first time, and to see work and talk with many craftspeople, collectors and curators. It deepens my appreciation of the uniqueness of the place and enriches my interest in crafts created here. In jurying Hawaii Craftsmen 2014 I noted the exceptional amount of work in wood and the strong influence of Asia. I was struck by the number of perforated works in several mediums, and I'd like to think that says something about the openness of the hospitable people who made this experience such a pleasure!

Gail Toma

My whimsical expression of Cnidaria (jellyfish).

When I started making jellyfish, I thought only of their beauty and how relaxing they are to watch. The more I learned about them, the more frightening they became.

Jellyfish can range from gossamers a millimeter in length to giants with bells over a meter across and weighing almost half a ton. There is a species, Irukandji, that is so venomous that the brush of a single tentacle can kill a person.

Jellyfishes are now found in unprecedented numbers in our oceans. They feed on the fishes and sea life and chase away the visitors we rely on. Jellyfish blooms have been sucked into the cooling systems of nuclear ships and power plants, causing complete shut downs. The exploding jellyfish population threatens food supplies, ecosystems, economies, and possibly the oceans as we know them. What started as a journey into whimsy led me to something frightening.
